Transition to Adulthood: Be Ready, Start Early

The purpose of school, for students with and without disabilities, is to prepare for adult life. Children with disabilities may need extra support in order to be as independent as possible, participate in post-high school education or training, and have the career of their choice. If a child receives services under an Individualized Education Program (IEP), Virginia's Special Education regulations require that transition planning start at age 14. This is younger than the federal age requirement of 16 under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. An IEP Transition Plan spells out the services and supports the child needs, beyond academics, to achieve those post-high school goals. So, Be Ready!, Start Early!
