

### It's never too early to prepare for exiting high school!



Exiting High School! It's an exciting time and it's never too early to plan and prepare. For some families, graduation will take place in a few months while other students may have a few years to prepare. One of the most important decisions, to be made as early as possible is what kind of diploma your student will be working towards. In Virginia, there is the Standard Diploma, the Advanced Studies Diploma, and the Applied Studies Diploma.

The Standard and Advanced Studies Diplomas are the diplomas that will allow your student to attend a two or four-year college or university as well as certain trade schools or other post-high school training options. The Applied Studies Diploma is for a small number of students who have significant cognitive disabilities and have not participated in the Standards of Learning (SOL) curriculum track. An Applied Studies Diploma, which shows the completion of IEP goals, can be the right choice for some students but it can have an impact on the student's future, including post-secondary education and employment opportunities. So it's important to review diploma options as early as possible in your student's school career to ensure that they are on the right track and that you are working together to plan their post-graduation future!
